



The cry of Jesus on the cross at the very end was, therefore the cry of awareness that all was indeed accomplished, brought to its consummation. He knew that he coud, at last, give back to the One he loved the unshackled fullness of love, and in so doing cary with him on the surge of that passion the love which is the essential being of all creation. This is, in a sense, the moment of resurrection, or rather it is the moment at which that process begins, for the resurrection is not a single event but the everextending 'outflow' of the energy previously dammed up by the power of sin and death.






